To these ends, it offers detailed bibliographies (as well as links to valuable resources online) on the History of philosophy and theory (particular periods, schools of thought, and individual theorists), the Regions (the social and historical contexts) in which particular philosophical and theoretical traditions have developed, and key Topics addressed by philosophers and theorists (concerning the nature of the Mind, the Social Formation, and so on). This massive website (consisting, at last count, of almost 1300 pages), which is updated on a daily basis, is accessed by hundreds and sometimes thousands of visitors from all over the world who are referred in many cases by online encyclopedias like Wikipedia and search engines such as Google.
